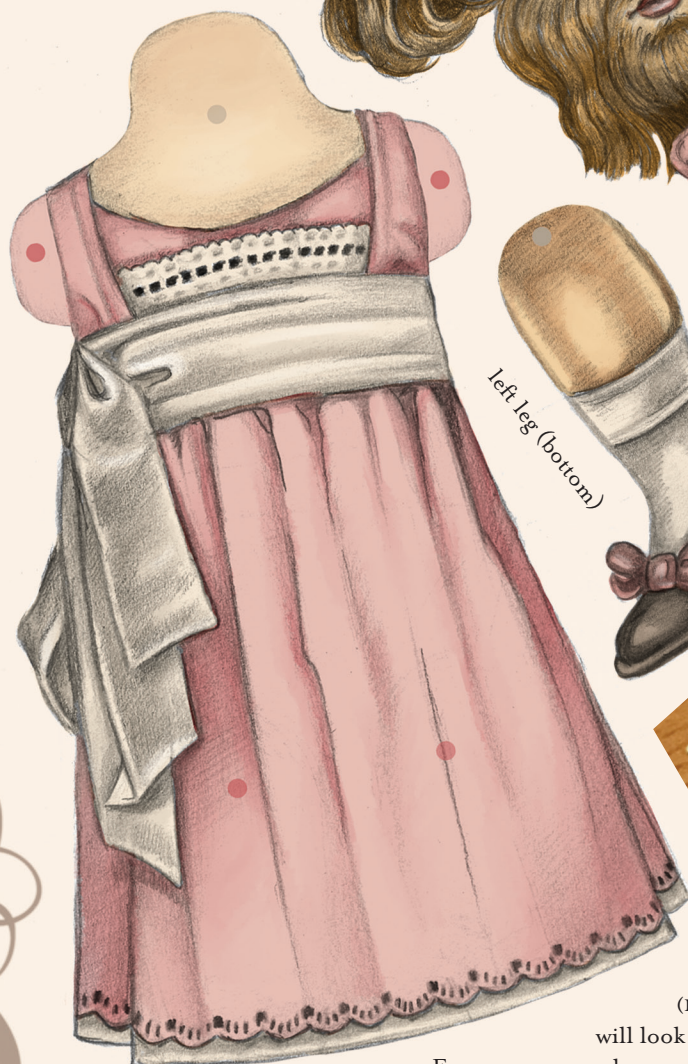


Hermione

This is Hermione, who has a very rare genetic condition called hypertrichosis which causes excessive hair growth on portions of the body. It is sometimes referred to as "werewolf syndrome". Hermione celebrates her hairiness by decorating her thick tresses and beard with lovely satin ribbons ❖

INSTRUCTIONS: Using scissors, carefully cut out each separate piece of the paper puppet. Locate the small coloured dot/s on each limb and pierce with a small sewing needle or pin. Purchase some brads (small metal paper fasteners, see example below) at an art supply or craft store (or find online). The mini brads (3/8-inch) are best for this scale of puppet. Push end of brad through the holes pierced in each limb and connect to the body of the puppet. Pry the two small prongs of the brads apart to affix. If you cannot locate brads, joints can be created using knotted string, embroidery floss or twine. You have a new paper puppet friend! ❖
